


Views on President Trump's Job Performance

FINDINGS FROM THE JUNE 2017 AP-NORC NATIONAL POLL

- Most Americans disapprove of President Trump's stewardship of the country
- Thirty-five percent approve of the job Trump has been doing and 64 percent disapprove.
- Presidential approval is highly partisan, with three-quarters of Republicans expressing approval and 9 in 10 Democrats expressing disapproval.
- Nearly half approve of Trump's handling of the threat of terrorism. Fewer approve of how he deals with the economy, immigration, and foreign policy.

When it comes to specific issues, nearly half of Americans approve of Trump's handling of the threat of terrorism % who say they approve of Trump's handling of ...




Questions: Overall, do you approve or disapprove of the way Donald Trump is handling...? If you had to choose, do you lean more toward approving or disapproving of the way Donald Trump is handling ...?

- Few Americans believe that President Trump respects the democratic institutions and traditions of the United States
- Thirty-four percent say Trump has a great deal or a fair amount of respect for this country's institutions and traditions, while 65 percent say he has not too much or no respect at all.
- Sixty-nine percent of Republicans say Trump has a great deal or a fair amount of respect for America's institutions and traditions, while 89 percent of Democrats say he has not too much or no respect at all.

- Health care, the economy, and terrorism are the most important issues to Americans
- About 8 in 10 say health care, the economy, and terrorism are important to them personally.

Question: How important are each of the following issues to you personally?

Democrats and Republicans disagree about the direction the country is headed

- Overall, one-third say the country is heading in the right direction while two-thirds say it is heading in the wrong direction.
- Sixty percent of Republicans say the country is heading in the right direction while 84 percent of Democrats say the country is heading in the wrong direction.
- Regardless of party affiliation, Congressional approval is low
- Twenty-two percent approve of the way Congress is handling its job and 75 percent disapprove.
- Majorities of both Democrats (81 percent) and Republicans (66 percent) view Congress in a negative light.

This survey was conducted The Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs Research, with funding from The Associated Press and NORC at the University of Chicago. Interviews were conducted using AmeriSpeak® with a nationally representative sample of 1,068 adults age 18 and over online and using landlines and cell phones from June 8-11, 2017.
